TOOLS FOR EVIDENCE TRACKING

SPREADSHEET

- Good for tracking small amounts of data
- Basic reporting

ACCESS DATABASE

- · Good for tracking small to medium amounts of data
- Ability to produce standard reports

SQL DATABASE

- · Good for tracking small to large amounts of data
- Ability to produce complex report

DETERMINE WHAT YOU NEED TO COLLECT

- HOW MANY SA KITS ARE COLLECTED ANNUALLY:
 - Will you just be tracking SAKI kits or all kits?
 - How many kits will you be back loading?
- HOW MUCH CASE DATA ARE YOU COLLECTING?
 - Are you only collecting Kit/DNA data?
 - Will you be collecting data on the elements of the crime?
 - ViCAP?
- HOW AND WHO WILL YOU BE REPORTING TO?
 - SAKI grant reporting only?
 - State mandated requirements?

- 100% KIT SUBMISSION
- BAR CODE TRACKING OF SA KITS
- VICTIM/SURVIVOR PORTAL


DETERMINE INSTALLATION TYPE


- STATEWIDE SYSTEM

- DATA SHARING


GATHER STAKEHOLDERS

- SANES


BAR CODE TRACKING/SCANNING OF KITS




